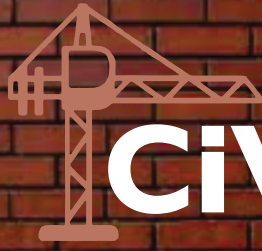

## A Webinar on "Importance of Admixture for Concrete" dated 22/11/2021

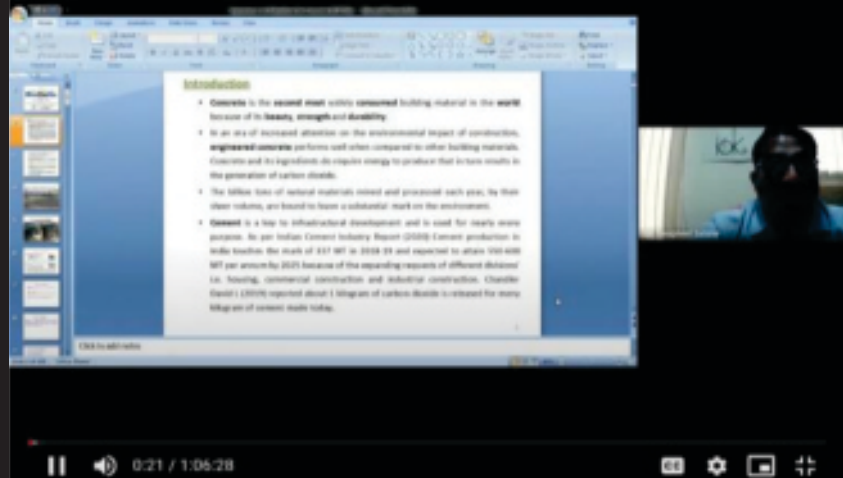

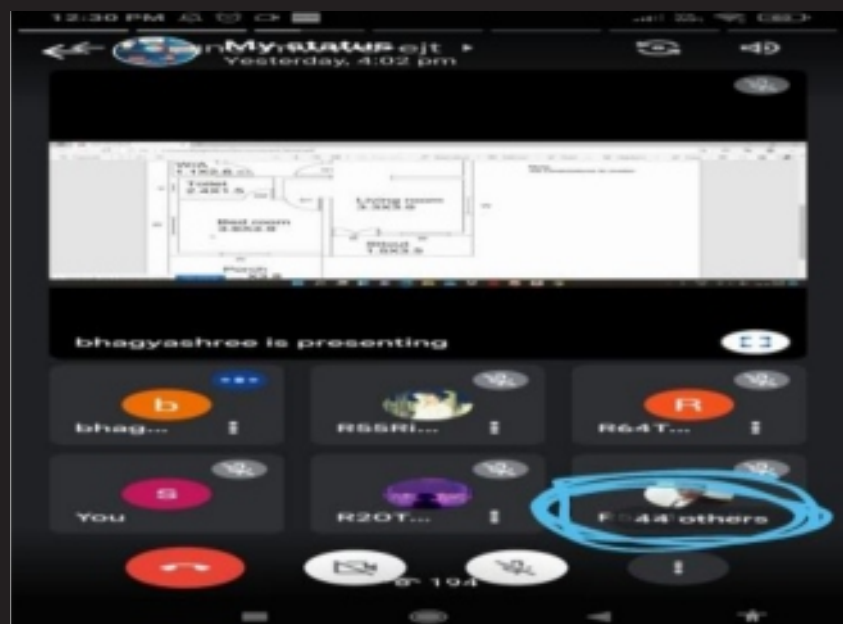
## Two days workshop (Webinar) on "Auto Cadd & STAAD Pro" dated 25 & 26 Jan 2022

I wasn't a pampered kid, but I had all the comforts one could ask for. I had my favorite meals cooked for me, my laundry was done by my mother, I hardly had to enter the kitchen, except for the occasional teaventures I decided to treat myself with. Who could have thought that laundry would be such an issue at some point in life? Having your favorite meals as you wished would be a dream. As I said I wasn't a pampered kid really, but as they say, "you only value something when it is gone". I was now.

Coming back from college, to the four walls I call home now, I threw my clothes in the laundry basket and laid down on the bed, not an ounce of strength to get up. I was tired as hell. It was a hectic day, we are the end of our session now, so there are the submissions, crunch of completing the syllabus. And this thing hit me. I had my mother do everything for me, right from the laundry, to polishing my shoes (so much for not being a spoilt kid). Hell, she even washed my undergarments. I had the food ready, even before I got home from school. Everything used to be on time, she did everything, with a wide smile, bearing all the tantrums without any complaints. I used to see my dad come home tired, working hard, pulling all the threads together, compromising all of his comforts just to give us a good life. To give a perspective of what I am saying, we didn't own a car right until I was in 11th grade (almost 80%-90% people own a car in the city we live), and I used to go to the best school in the state. To be honest, getting a car was not a tough thing for him, but he put the comfort of his children above his own comfort.

Whenever is used to study, my mother brought me loads of things to eat, delicacies. I could eat anything I want, whenever I wished to. I just had to say it, and I would have it.

I live in a hostel now, all that comfort gone. You can say I have learnt to value every grain of food now, the hard way. What wouldn't I give to have that life back. I don't call my mother much often. I avoid talking to her. Because whenever I do, all I am being asked if I eat properly, if I sleep properly, whether

I do my laundry on time, and I am tired of replying with a yes to everything, I am tired of lying.

The thing is, no I don't eat properly, because nothing in the world is as delicious as the food cooked by my mother, I don't sleep properly, because I have to worry about a hundred things at a time, things that my parents so conveniently took care of, without letting us know how much was going on behind the scene, I fail to do my laundry, my clothes lie there in the basket for days together. I just miss my parents. I miss my mother. You can argue that every parent does that. Sure, everyone does, but that is not the point. The thing is, sitting here on my bed, staring at my spoiled uniform, I realize, that I would give anything to have that comfort back, to live that laid-back life, the life my parents so easily gave up. Just for me to have one. As I said, "you only value something when it is gone".

### **Coming back to the Hostel life.**

Sometimes, it just gets over the top. Everything seems like a mess. Concentrating and focusing becomes difficult. You just want to disappear from that place and never look back. But, then comes the realisation about why you are there in the first place. Everything comes with a price. To achieve your goals, you have to toil hard for it. Everything has it's own set of pros and cons. But, it is upto an individual, what he wants to lay his focus upon.
